On Thursday, September 14, 2023, Dr. Alok Chaturvedi (Daniels School of Business) presented at our Lunch & Learn Series. His talk titled, *Data, Models, and AI* generated a great discussions and questions from the audience, asking, for example, about the data-observer-model-instruction patterns and how data and instruments of AI can be utilized in an ethical manner. We had 41 participants at the Lunch & Learn utilizing the main floor and two rooms in the second floor where a livestream of the Lunch & Learn was shown on screens.
