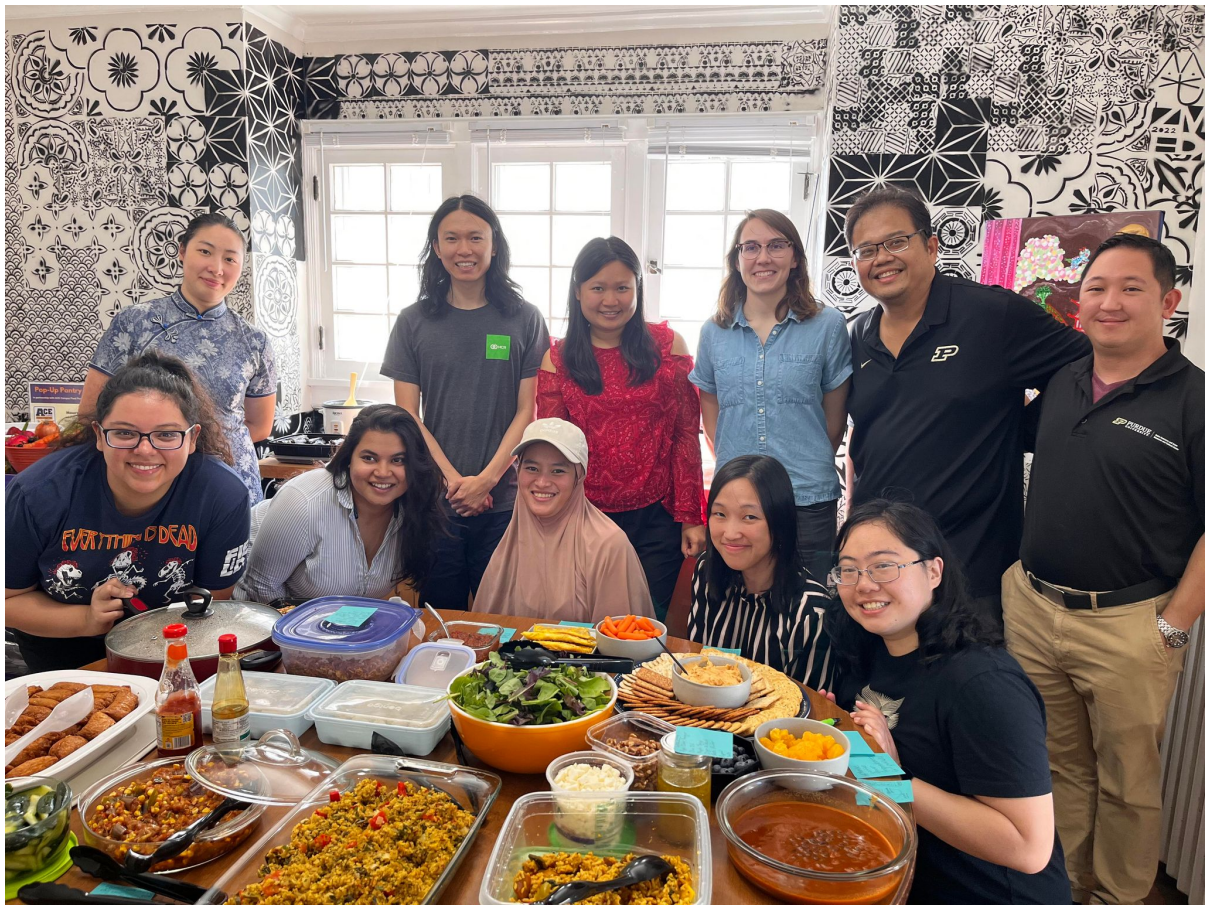
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Review of the Week

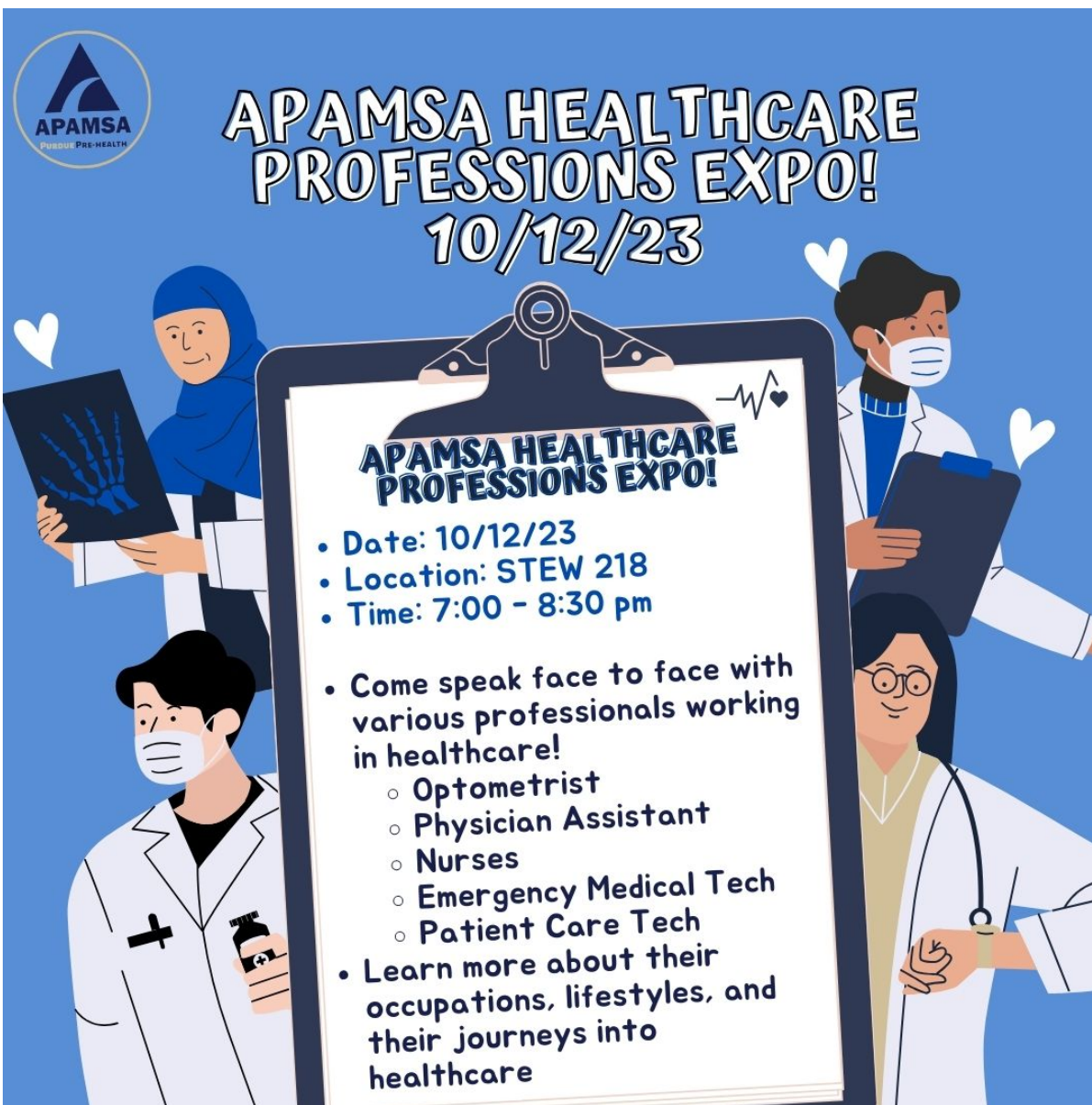

Description

A PurdueVotes Voter Fellow is a role within the PurdueVotes Coalition for students who are interested in engaging their community civically through voter registration and education. The term for this role is one calendar year with a commitment of 15 hours total.

Learning Outcomes

As a PurdueVotes Fellow, you will:

1. Expand and improve your understanding of active participation in your community.
2. Demonstrate your commitment to your community and engage your peers in civic engagement.
3. Engage your peers in discussions surrounding civic engagement and active citizenship.
4. Practice and develop communication skills.

Competencies

As a Voter Fellow, you will develop the following Professional Development competencies:

1. Continuous Learning
2. Personal Responsibility
3. Service & Social Responsibility
4. Ethics

Expectations

PurdueVotes Fellows are expected to:

- Demonstrate consistent involvement and dedication to PurdueVotes' mission and initiatives throughout their time as a Voter Fellow (November 2023-January 2025)
- Attend and actively participate in all training sessions organized by PurdueVotes

Registration, Education, & Participation Expectations:

- Register at least 25-50 students to vote by the following;
- Registering students to vote at 5 to 6 PurdueVotes tabling events
- Help facilitate 2 "Be a Voter" workshops per semester
- Share or repost PurdueVotes social media content as part of PurdueVotes' social media strategy
- Assist PurdueVotes in mobilizing voters on Election Day and Vote Early Day
- Help manage tabling activities at polling centers to promote civic engagement

The Office of Summer and Winter Sessions at Purdue University (West Lafayette) is seeking its next Director. This student-centered, adaptive, collaborative, and innovative unit is committed to leveraging summer and winter opportunities to maximize student success. Their outstanding work has been recognized by the National Resource Center for the First-Year Experience and Students in Transition as a recent recipient of their John N Gardner Institutional Excellence Award. The number of students (e.g., high school students, incoming and current Purdue students) engaged in summer has increased by 69% in the last 10 years (23,022 students in Summer 2023) and winter session is a new academic term at Purdue with excellent potential.

The Director of Summer and Winter Sessions reports to the Senior Associate Vice Provost for Teaching and Learning and is responsible for the overall leadership of both summer and winter sessions (team of 8-10 staff), with specific responsibility for academic program development, course capacity, financial and budget planning, assessment/continuous improvement, and marketing. The Director of Summer and Winter Sessions must be innovative, forward-thinking, and a transparent and direct communicator. Their leadership style needs to include evidence of commitment to equity and inclusion, promotion of staff development and mentorship, and advancement of essential collaborations across campus (e.g., academic departments, residential life, student success units).
