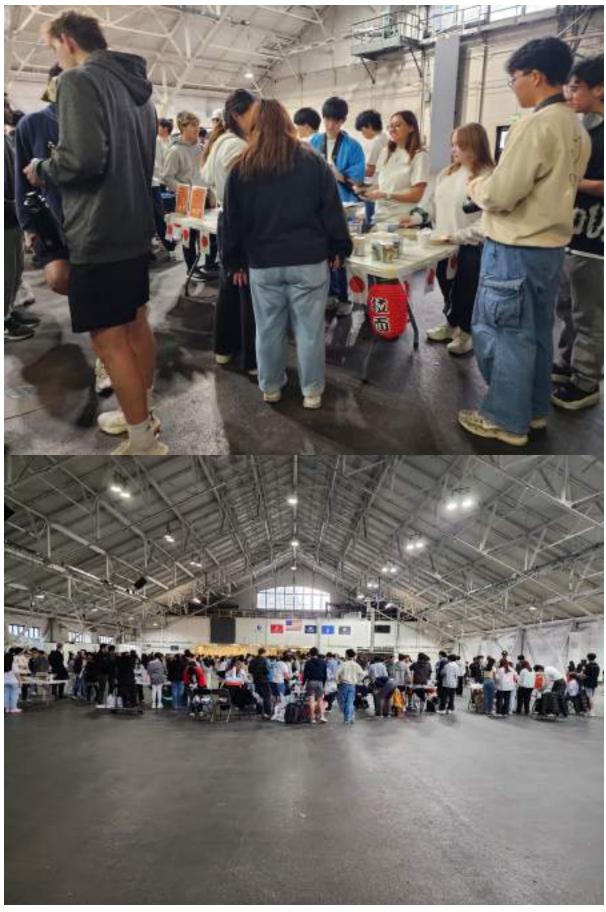
Week in Review

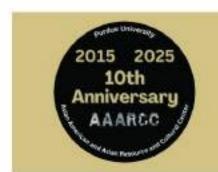

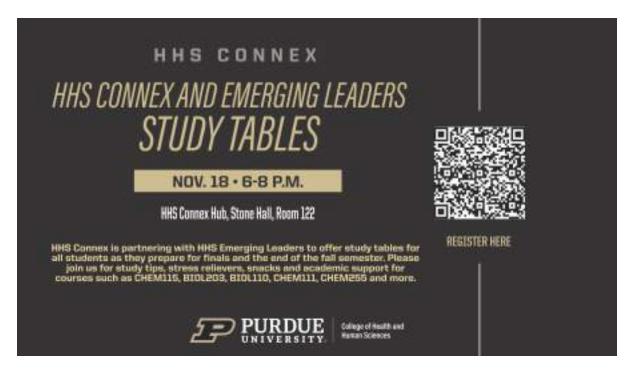
