The AAARCC took our Lunch and Learn participants to Purdue Student Farm on Thursday, September 12, 2024. Farm manager Chris Adair explained about the work that they do and about the Boilermaker Vegetable Season pass. We got to walk around the farm and see varieties of vegetables such as tomatoes, peppers, eggplants, and kale.





The 2024 Retracing Our Roots retreat was a success! This regional retreat is a partnership of Purdue AAARCC, ACC Indiana University, and Multicultural Center at Indiana University Indianapolis, to provide students and staff with opportunities to network and learn about identities, leadership, and advocacy. The AAARCC took eight undergraduate students (including two students from Purdue University in Indianapolis), five graduate students, and three full-time staff to the retreat. Dr. Mindy Tan (Lecturer, African American Studies Program), was one of the retreat speakers. She presented on "Identity and Lived Experiences," shared her pedagogy for teaching across differences in the classroom, and invited retreat participants to a creative self-portrait collage activity.

#### ARISE Lab Study Participant Recruitment: Diversity Education Study

We are conducting a research study to understand college students' identity development, opinions on social issues in U.S. society, and their mental health and well-being. We are interested in how various college experiences—such as engagement with campus resource centers, enrollment in diversity-related courses, and the composition of friendships-relate to attitudes toward social issues, motivation for social action, and mental health over time. Our study will involve a two-point survey. The first survey will be distributed during the initial weeks of the semester, followed by a second survey toward the end of the semester.

The study, which has been approved by the University of Nebraska-Lincoln IRB 20240623613EP, asks students to participate in a photovoice study with other college students across the country. They will ask students about the strengths and challenges to healing and recovery from intimate partner violence. Students will receive \$20 compensation for participating in each of the six photovoice sessions and can earn up to \$120.
