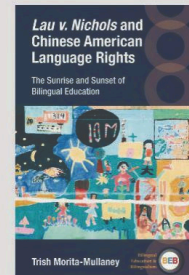

Last week, the AAARCC and Center for Career Opportunities (CCO) co-hosted a Job Negotiations workshop as part of AAARCC's Lunch and Learn series and CCO's International Student Workshop series. Stephen Roach from CCO presented about negotiation skills necessary to navigate the currently challenging job market. Participants also discussed a job-negotiation scenario with each other and learned about the importance of understanding our own priorities when making offer-related decisions.



The AAARCC participated in this year's Latino Cultural Center (LCC) Dia de Los Muertos event. Undergraduate student staff Aerrielle Condino led our team in dedicating the AAARCC's table this year to those who are impacted by dementia. To prepare for the ofrenda, Aerrielle conducted research on how dementia impacted individuals and communities, and made a display based on the research. Thank you, Aerrielle, for this work!



The AAARCC Director Dr. Pamela K. Sari presented at the American Public Health Association (APHA) Annual meeting in Minneapolis. The presentation titled "Participatory research in connecting cultural identity development and mental health of Asian and Asian American adolescents in the Midwest" is a research partnership with Dr. Stewart Chang Alexander (Purdue Public Health Department), Dr Michael Viega (Montclair State University), and the rest of the research team.

Throughout the conference, Dr. Sari also had the opportunity to connect with faculty and students from Purdue Public Health Department, alumni in Greater Minneapolis area, and with Theater Mu, the second largest Asian American theater organization in the country.



The AAARCC Program Administrator, Samantha Huang, received guests from Purdue Extension Community Development team for their retreat mobile workshops. Participant had the opportunity to learn about the AAARCC's pedagogical, cultural, and advocacy work, and discuss future partnerships.

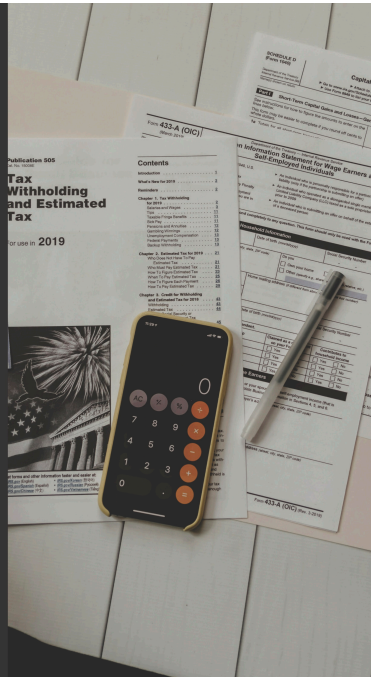
