

AAARCC Lunch and Learn Series







It's easy to talk about social change, but how does it actually happen?

Community Organizing means building and growing meaningful relationships with people in our communities based on shared values and common concerns. The COI will equip you with the tools to build relationships and power to effectively bring about social change. The institute consists of interactive small group activities, large group discussion, and a working lunch for participants to practice their one-to-one skills.

This institute will be facilitated by Brooke Shannon and Bennett Foster. Brooke is an Assistant Professor at the University of Memphis teaching political science and urban affairs. She studies public policy and American politics at the local level. She volunteers with the union and civic/ housing organizations regularly in electoral and community politics. Bennett is an artist, musician, and political organizer from Memphis, TN with over 10 years of experience in grassroots labor and community organizing, movement training, and political campaigns across Tennessee. Bennett serves as Executive Director of Memphis For All, building community and electoral power inside and outside of the ballot box.
