Thank you to Purdue Student Union Board for inviting the AAARCC, LGBTQ Center, and Libraries and School of Information Studies to collaborate on PSUB's Books and Coffee event series featuring author Putsata Reang on February 27, 2025.


We truly appreciate the Department of English, Dr. Aparajita Sagar, and Putsata's team for inviting the AAARCC to host a memoir writing workshop with Putsata. Thank you to Putsata for visiting the AAARCC and creating a unique workshop for our faculty and students. Attendees reflected on their existential wounds and the stories they carry but struggle to share. This intimate engagement gave attendees opportunities to connect with Putsata and exchange stories.

In the week leading up to Putsata Reang's campus visit, the AAARCC hosted book discussions about the narratives of Cambodian and QTBIPOC refugees in America, including the major themes of displacement, familial bonds, cultural and filial duty, mental health, and coming out featured in her memoir *Ma and Me*.

The AAARCC was able to provide ASL interpreters and copies of Putsata's book to support this program, thanks to a grant from the Indiana Humanities and the National Endowment for the Humanities. Thank you to George Hanlin, Director of Grants for Indiana Humanities, for attending the program and sharing your support for our community.
