All video audition submissions will be due February 28th, 2025 at 11:59 PM.

# Video Submission Formatting:

- All submissions must be unlisted YouTube links with video. Links via Dropbox or mp4/audio attachments will **not** be accepted.
- Please double check that your link is not set to private before submitting.

- Etudes and scales must be in one video, though it does not need to be one continuous take. Please do not submit more than one video unless you are auditioning for more than one ensemble.
  - If you are auditioning for more than one ensemble with different requirements, such as jazz band and concert band, or jazz band and orchestra, please submit 2 separate video auditions within the submission form.
  - If you are auditioning for wind ensemble and concert band, or concert band and orchestra winds, you may submit one video. The audition requirements are the same and will be viewed by the same instructor.
- There will be **no sight-reading** component to the video submission.
- Please include the following before you begin to play and in the video description text. You may include these as text overlay or spoken to the camera:
  - Name
  - Instrument
  - Hometown/State
  - Major
  - Ensemble(s) you are auditioning for
    - If also auditioning for AAMB, please note this.
  - Name and composer of the piece you are playing
  - Have you accepted your admittance to Purdue yet? (This will not affect the decision-making process.)

#### **Final Notes:**

- Approximately 20-30 students will be selected to receive a one-time scholarship gift. Recipients are chosen by faculty based on a variety of factors, including but not limited to ability and departmental need. Scholarship amount varies from year to year, and this year's amount is to be determined.
- All scholarship offers will be made by May 1st.
- This submission is for scholarship consideration only, and a separate ensemble placement audition will be required this summer. # **What to Prepare:**

#### **Concert Band & Orchestra Winds/Percussion**

- Please prepare an advanced level solo piece without accompaniment. Your
  piece should be a few minutes, showing contrasting styles. You may make any
  necessary cuts. Please direct questions regarding what would be considered
  suitable advanced repertoire to your private teacher or band/orchestra director.
- Please prepare two, two octave major scales.

# **Orchestra Strings**

- Please prepare an advanced level solo piece without accompaniment. Your
  piece should be a few minutes, showing contrasting styles. You may make any
  necessary cuts. Please direct questions regarding what would be considered
  suitable advanced repertoire to your private teacher or orchestra director.
- Please prepare the following scales:
  - Violin players should choose two from A, C, or E-flat major. Three octaves, ascending and descending.
  - Viola/Cello players should choose two from D, F, or A major. Three octaves, ascending and descending.
  - Bass players should choose two from E, F, or G major. Three octaves, ascending and descending.

#### Saxophones:

- All students should play from the pick-up to mm13 and play to the end. The backing track starts at the beginning, so come in at pick-up to mm13.
- **Students** should improvise with the chord changes over the 2<sup>nd</sup> full chorus of the backing track.
- All students should play a 2-octave chromatic scale.

### **Trumpets:**

- All students should play from the pick-up to mm13 and play to end. The backing track starts at the beginning, so come in at pick-up to mm13.
- **Students** should improvise with the chord changes over the 2<sup>nd</sup> full chorus of the backing track.
- All students should play a 2-octave chromatic scale.

#### **Trombones & Bass Trombones:**

- All students should play from the pick-up to mm13 and play to the end. The backing track starts at the beginning, so come in at pick-up to mm13.
- **Students** should improvise with the chord changes over the 2<sup>nd</sup> full chorus of the backing track.
- All students should play a 2-octave chromatic scale.

#### **Guitar/Vibraphone:**

- Comp for the first 12 measures of the etude.
- All students should play the written music from the pick-up to mm13 and play to the end.
- **Students** should improvise with the chord changes over the 2<sup>nd</sup> full chorus of the backing track.
- All students should play a 2-octave chromatic scale

#### Piano:

- Comp for the first 12 measures of the etude.
- All students should play the written music from the pick-up to mm13 and play to the end.
- **Students** should improvise with the chord changes over the 2<sup>nd</sup> full chorus of the backing track.
- All students should play a 2-octave chromatic scale with both hands.

• In addition, please prepare a piece (no longer than 1 minute) that you feel best exemplifies your jazz piano skills.

### Bass:

- All students should play Etude #1 in its entirety with the backing track.
- All students should play Etude #2 in its entirety with a metronome.
- **Students** should improvise with the chord changes over the 2<sup>nd</sup> full chorus of the backing track.
- All students should play a 2-octave chromatic scale.

### Drums:

- All students should play the etude in its entirety with the backing track w/o drums.
- **Students** should improvise over the 2<sup>nd</sup> full chorus of the backing track.
