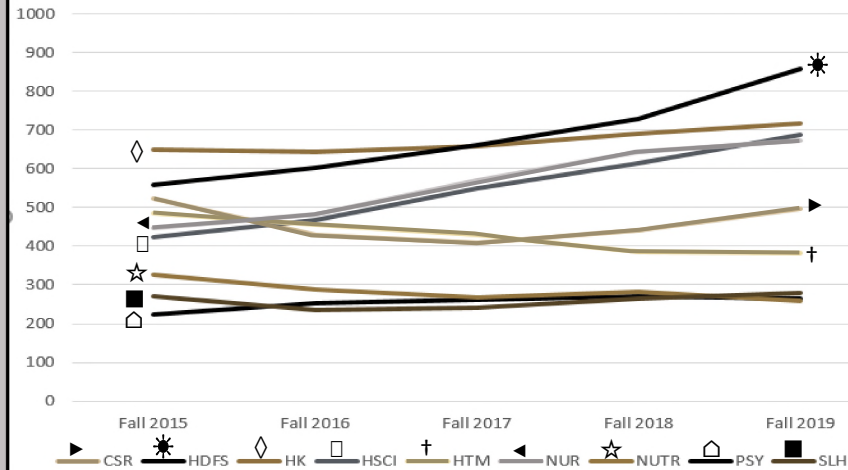

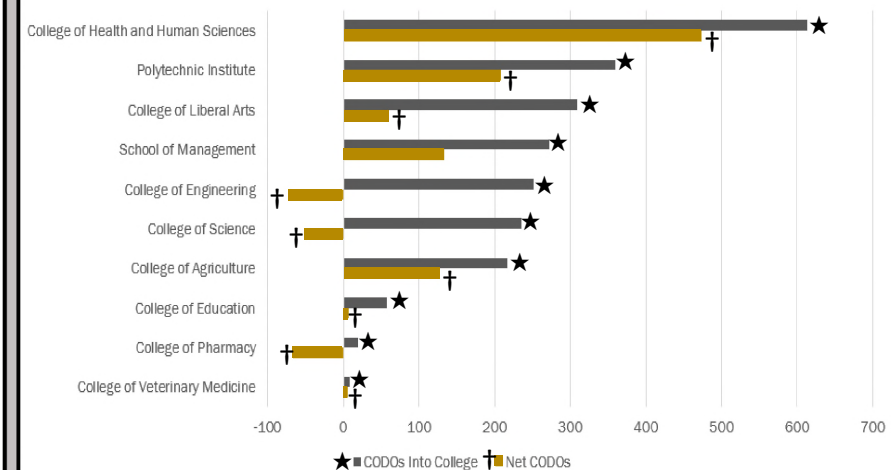

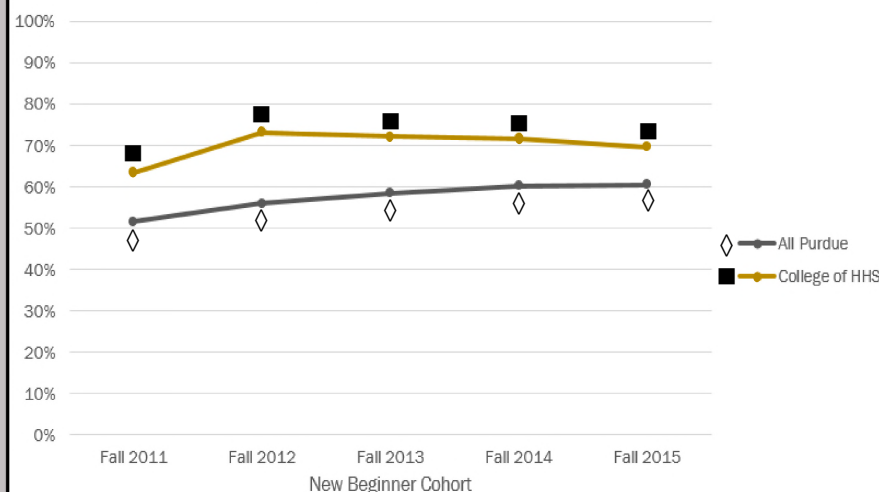
College of HHS Undergraduate Enrollment



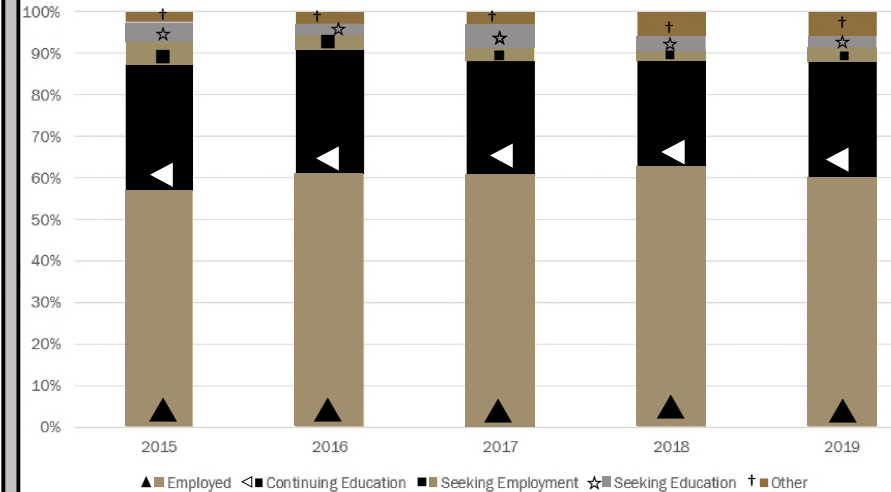
CODOs by College, Fall 2018 to Fall 2019



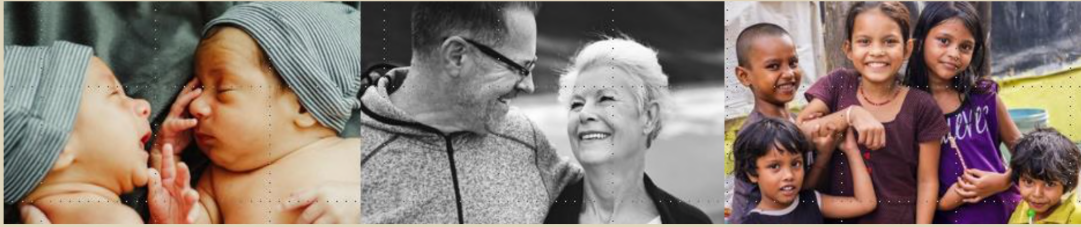
4-Year Graduation Rate, College of HHS vs. All Purdue

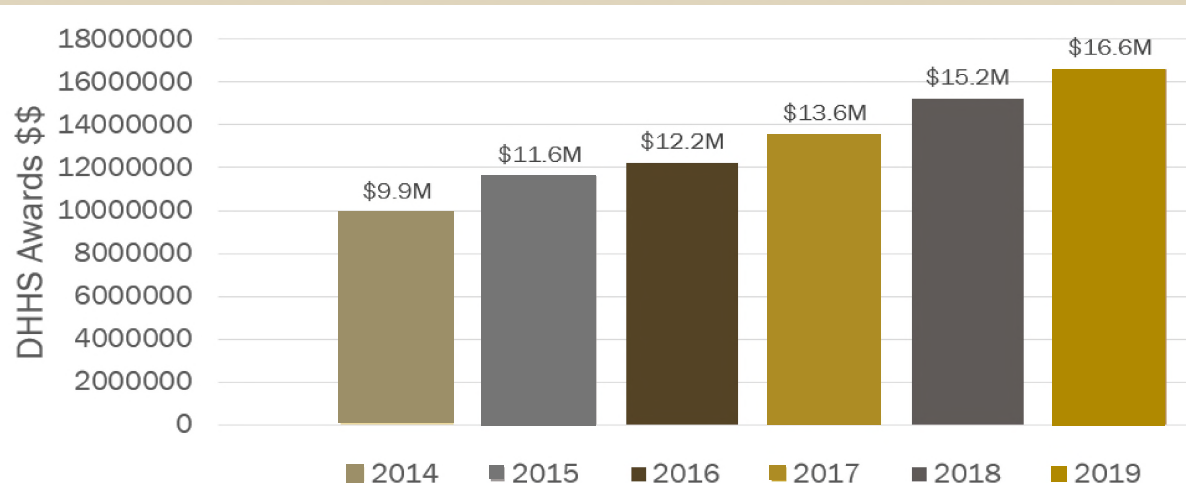

HHS Research and Recognition Highlights

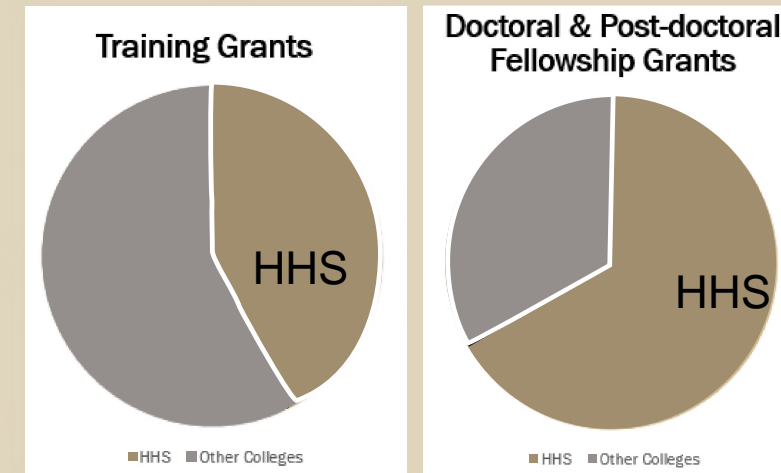
- Prof. Jessica Huber elected fellow of the **National Academy of Inventors**

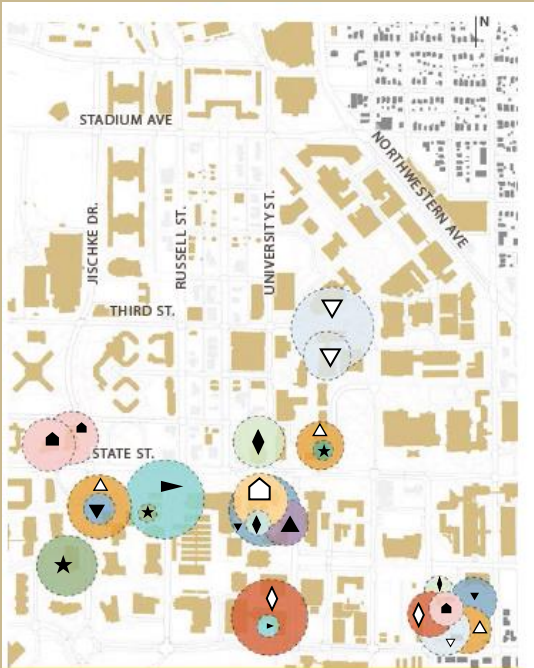
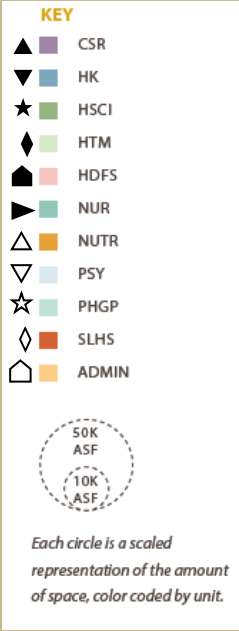


Figure ES 8: Proposed HHS unit locations (12 buildings)
