PNW Westville Campus: Engagement and Strategies



Faculty Engagement

- 2017: Committee of Senior Leaders from Westville engaged faculty and staff in several Open Forum presentations.
- 2019: Chancellor met one to one with over 40 Westville faculty members, tenure/tenure track.
- 2020-2021: Provost collaborated with Faculty Senate Westville Committee.
- 2021-2022: Continued collaborative efforts with all faculty.



Budget: Break Even Analysis

- Budget Incentive Model Estimated a Loss of:
 - \$4 million in 2019-2020
 - \$3.6 million in 2020-2021
- PNW overall budget is absorbing the losses:
 - 80% of undergraduate students at the Hammond campus
 - 20% of undergraduate students at the Westville campus
- To ensure future success, the Westville campus needs to be self-sustaining.

Strategy for Student Success and Retention

- Learning Communities and Block Scheduling
- 93% of Courses Face to Face for Fall 2021
- Centralized Advising
- Investments in Technology (Testing Lab and Nursing lab)
- Employer Engagement and Interview Suite
- Early Warning System for at Risk Student Behaviors
- As needed, faculty will be assigned to meet student demand.
