Subject: Posthumous Degree for Austin Fisher

On April 29, 2025, Daniel Castro, Dean of the Purdue Polytechnic Institute sent a memo requesting a posthumous Bachelor of Science degree in Cybersecurity in the Department of Computer and Information Technology at Purdue be awarded.

The policy states the awarding of a posthumous degree by Purdue University requires that the deceased student completed:

- 1. At least 85% of the credit hour requirements
- 2. Most of the requirements for the major
