EMERGENCY PROCEDURES



TORNADO


SEEK SHELTER

- Move to an interior room on the lowest level.
- Stay away from windows and exterior doors.
- Listen to a weather radio or local news for updates.
- Stay away from hazardous materials.

FIRE

EVACUATE

- Pull the fire alarm.
- · CALL 911.
- Leave the building, CLOSE DOORS.



Assemble in a designated area.

ACTIVE SHOOTER

RUN - HIDE - FIGHT

- CALL 911.
- Leave the building.
- If evacuation is not possible, hide in a concealed place.



- Lock and barricade door, turn off the lights.
- Wait for law enforcement.
- As a LAST RESORT, overpower the shooter.

MEDICAL EMERGENCY

STAY CLEAR

- CALL 911.
- Provide the location, nature of injury or illness, current condition of the victim and other requested information.
- Do not move the victim unless in immediate danger.
- If trained, administer first aid or CPR.

UTILITY FAILURE

IDENTIFY LOCATION

- Call the Work Request Center or PUPD to report issues.
- Be prepared to provide failure type and location.
- University officials may evacuate a building due to utility failures.

SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING

 Examples include a person is behaving strangely, an object is out of the ordinary and there is a gut feeling that something is wrong.



If something is spotted, CALL 911.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

STAY BACK

- If life threatening, pull fire alarm, evacuate and CALL 911.
- If not life threatening, call EHS (PUPD on nights and weekends), provide information on type of incident and location.
- If contact is made with a hazardous material, decontaminate and seek medical attention as necessary.

BOMB THREAT

REMAIN CALM

 Get as much information as possible from the caller – location of device, what it looks like, what will cause it to explode.



- Note background sounds, gender of caller and any notable characteristics of the caller's voice.
- CALL 911.

During an emergency, always CALL 911 FIRST.
