Tips to Navigating Construction Sites

- Construction sites can pose both short and long-term disruptions to normal pedestrian, bike and automobile traffic. Sidewalks and streets may be impacted without notice.
- Signs will always be posted to indicate which areas are closed to traffic, with new areas of travel highlighted
- If work is being done near exits or entrances, signs are posted to not use these doors. Examples are **NO EXIT** or **EMERGENCY EXIT ONLY**. This means these are NOT to be used unless there is an actual emergency inside the building
- Sidewalk closures will be marked with signs and barriers. Additionally, new paths of travel will be determined. Please follow the posted path. **Do not walk in traffic lanes if sidewalks are blocked.**
- Construction sites bordered by fences are closed to the general public and posted with **NO TRESPASSING**. These areas are under control by contractors and law enforcement will be involved if entrance to the site occurs without
