PURPOSE | The Certificate in Entrepreneurship and Innovation Program empowers you to turn innovative ideas into action. In this flexible program designed to complement any major, you will:

- Develop viable business models through market research and financial analysis
- · Acquire the business literacy and professional skills demanded by today's employers

BENEFITS | Upon completion, you receive an official certificate, which is noted on your academic transcript and presented at graduation. This unique and multidisciplinary experience offers a number of benefits including:

ELIGIBILITY | Simply enroll in the first introductory entrepreneurship course, ENTR 20000, and connect with your academic advisor. The program is open to all undergraduates enrolled at Purdue's West Lafayette and Indianapolis locations who have approximately four semesters remaining in their academic programs.

TWO INTRODUCTORY CORE COURSES

TWO OPTION COURSES

Option courses provide you with discipline or industry specific depth in areas which are relevant to entrepreneurship and innovation. They are offered through the Certificate in Entrepreneurship and Innovation Program as well as departments across the university.


