#### Major of the Month: Quantitative Business Economics

If you enjoy working with numbers, data, and have an interest in economics, consider the School of Business' newest major: Quantitative Business Economics (QBE). Students in this major will learn economic theory, business acumen, and statistical techniques, all of which will give graduates the tools needed to make informed data-driven decisions. The QBE plan of study includes coursework in computational economics, machine learning, game theory, and other business-related topics such as money, banking, and international trade. Students will also have the opportunity to participate in projects with business partners to gain insight into using skills in data analysis to solve real-world problems. Graduates of this major can expect move into roles as business analysts, data scientists, financial analysts, as well as market and policy researchers.
