Behavioral Expectations

- Purdue University Student Regulations
 - Code of Student Conduct
 - Applies to <u>all Purdue University Students</u>
 - Includes behavior that occurs both on and off of the Purdue University campus



Behavioral Expectations

Most Common Violations Include:

- Academic Integrity
 - Plagiarism
- High Risk Alcohol Events
 - Operating While Intoxicated
 - Intoxicated in Public
- Illegal Drugs and Controlled Substances
 - Includes possession of marijuana and drug paraphernalia



Student Rights

Purdue University Bill of Student Rights

- Commitment to Freedom of Expression
- Accurately and plainly stated information to understand course expectations and policies
- Course grades are based on academic performance
- Commitment to shared governance

COMMITMENT TO FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION

New Graduate Student Orientation August 17, 2018



BACKGROUND

Purdue Statement of Commitment to Freedom of Expression

- When: Board of Trustees meeting, May 2015
- Why: To reaffirm commitment to free speech principles
 - o First *public* university to do so
 - Prior schools were Chicago and Princeton
 - o The 21st "green light" university (out of >500)
 - Now three "green light" campuses

Who:

- Board of Trustees
- PSG and PGSG
- Task Force of Senate Equity and Diversity Committee

So what?

- Refined our stance relative to speech on campus
- Differentiated Purdue from general trend



WHAT THE BOARD'S ACTION DID:

- Adopted our own version of the "Chicago Principles"
 - An articulation of the critical importance of freedom of expression in higher education
 - A description of Purdue's commitment to ensuring "broadest possible latitude to speak, write, listen, challenge and learn"
 - A recognition of Purdue values of civility and respect
 - A recognition that there <u>are</u> some exceptions to protected speech
- Amended language in five existing policies:
 - Regulations Governing Student Conduct
 - Bill of Student Rights (Classroom Expression)
 - Guidelines for Speech and Expression on Campus
 - University Residences Guidelines: Bulletin Boards
 - Violent Behavior Policy



WHAT THE BOARD'S ACTION DID NOT DO:

- Increase Purdue's legal obligations under the First Amendment or otherwise
 - Principles already exist under U.S. Constitution
 - Principles reflect aspirations of higher education generally
- Abdicate Purdue's right and responsibility to regulate access to, and conduct on, its campus
 - May regulate with reasonable time, place and manner standard
 - May regulate behavior that is materially disruptive to educational environment
- Location matters; "forum analysis"
 - Traditional public forum
 - Designated public forum
 - Limited public forum
 - Nonpublic forum



KEY CONCEPTS

- Why is this important? Universities are the bastion of free speech.
 - They are "peculiarly the marketplace of ideas" (U.S. Supreme Court in Healy v. James, 1972)
- "The University is not engaged in making ideas safe for students. It is engaged in making students safe for ideas. Thus it permits the freest expression of views before students, trusting to their good sense in passing judgment on these views. Only in this way can it best serve American democracy."
 - --University of California President Clark Kerr, 1961 response to complaints about a Communist speaking on Berkeley campus



KEY CONCEPTS, CONTINUED

- We are the "State"
- There are exceptions to protected speech, but they are narrow:

Defamation, obscenity, disruption of academic environment, true threats, inciting imminent lawless action, "fighting words," harassment

We have a duty of "viewpoint neutrality"



KEY CONCEPTS, CONTINUED

- What should the University's response be?
 - Regulation versus restriction
 - Content versus conduct
- Civility and mutual respect are Purdue values and should aspired to, cannot be used to censor
- Counter speech with more speech
- Why not create safe spaces?




