

 Heart Berries is a powerful, poetic memoir of a woman's coming of age on the Seabird Island Indian Reservation in the Pacific Northwest. Having survived a profoundly dysfunctional upbringing only to find herself hospitalized and facing a dual diagnosis of PTSD and Bipolar II; Terese Mailhot is given a notebook and begins to write her way out of trauma. Mailhot is a <u>2017-18 Tecumseh Postdoctoral Fellow</u> in the Department of English.




Photo Exhibition - Opening Reception and Panel Presentation

"Stirring the Pot: Taking the Wanamaker Photos Home" is a digital-repatriation project that uses images from the collection of over 8,000 taken by Joseph Dixon on a then commercial endeavor to photograph Native American life between 1908 to 1921. Expanding on the work done on Tuscarora Indian Nation to the other Iroquois Nations, Stirring the Pot will collect stories from descendants of the people in the Wanamaker photos, and photograph living descendants with their ancestors. Allowing people to choose their favorite places, favorite adornments, and favorite poses participants take part in constructing their own narratives.

Drs Fileve Palmer and Joe Stahlman have curated five exhibits on public culture representing an array of photographic engagement. Engaging in projects that work towards the common good by building bridges between contentious communities which allow participants and audience members to interact and work towards common understandings of common humanity. Their latest exhibition engages public views of cultural expression without relegating the audiences to preconceived notions of identity, whereby humanizing a people that have been relegated to stories and mascots.
