Heart Berries is a powerful, poetic memoir of a woman's coming of age on the Seabird Island Indian Reservation in the Pacific Northwest. Having survived a profoundly dysfunctional upbringing only to find herself hospitalized and facing a dual diagnosis of PTSD and Bipolar II; Terese Mailhot is given a notebook and begins to write her way out of trauma. Mailhot is a 2017-18 Tecumseh Postdoctoral Fellow in the Department of English.
