CELD Lunch and Learn: Protection of Native American Cultural Resources through Repatriation

The Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA) was passed in 1990 to combat the theft of Indigenous religious practices, display of Native American human remains, and inappropriate sale of sacred objects yet it continues to be a major issue in Indian Country. Dorene Red Cloud (Oglala Lakota), Assistant Curator of Native American Arts at the Eiteljorg Museum, will discuss current repatriation efforts, provide basic knowledge of NAGPRA and other new legislation to support the return of cultural items, and share information on the protection of Indigenous cultural resources.
