

Bioprotection Plan: Purdue Veterinary Farm (Horses)

Prior to arrival:

- Moving into IN:
 - Negative Coggin's test and Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI), with official ID of each animal written or attached, written within 30 days of entry.
- Moving within IN:
 - Indiana equine moving within Indiana do NOT need paperwork or identification.

Upon arrival (In Brunner; prior to going to the Purdue Vet Farm):

- Brunner (initial intake):
 - Upon receipt: horses/ponies are monitored for health and well-being.
 - Full physical exam and notation of BCS
 - Oral exam and dental float as required
 - Removal of shoes
 - Testing:
 - Equine Infectious Anemia (Coggins Test) (if was not accompanied by negative Coggin's test performed in last 12 months)
 - Equine parvovirus and hepacivirus (blood donor geldings)
 - Fecal Flotation – quantitative (Fecal egg count)
- Purdue Vet Farm:
 - Assigned an official USDA neck band.
 - Assigned a black binder (the animal's individual record).
 - Include donation paperwork and documentation of all exams (i.e., general physical, lameness, neurologic, reproductive, etc.), notes, procedures, and results from the initial intake period.
 - Information may be printed from the HIS system (electronic hospital record system) and included under the appropriate section(s) of the animal's binder.

Preventative Maintenance Plan:

- Daily: Observations
- Monthly: See PVF SOP

Purdue Equine Farm (Veterinary Farm) Excluded Agents:

- Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA)
- Equine Parvovirus and Equine Hepacivirus (Blood donor geldings)
