What's changed since last year?

- Al has gotten smarter, faster, and better at conversations.
 - Advancements in Language Models: Systems like GPT-4 and GPT-5 can understand context, humor, and even emotions more accurately.
 Multimodal AI: New models can process not just text, but also images, audio, and video opening doors for better medical diagnostics and creative content generation.
- More natural voice assistants, smarter chatbots, and improved healthcare Al.
 - Smarter virtual assistants (like Alexa and Siri) can handle more complex requests and provide personalized recommendations.
 - Voice recognition has become more accurate, even with regional accents or background noise.

1. Stay Educated and Aware

- Regular scam awareness updates from trusted websites like AARP's Fraud Watch Network, FTC Scam site, snopes.com
- AI-powered scam alert apps (e.g., Truecaller or Norton LifeLock) that flag suspicious calls and texts; National do not call registry
 (https://www.donotcall.gov/); Indiana do not call
 (https://www.in.gov/attorneygeneral/consumer-protection-division/id-theft-prevention/do-not-call/)
- Big Tip: Have a family conversation: scam tactics and defense tactics.
 - Have a family codeword or ask specific details

2. Use Strong Digital Defenses

- Enable two-factor authentication (2FA) on all accounts.
- Al-driven password managers (like LastPass or Bitwarden) to create and store complex passwords.
- Install antivirus and anti-phishing software with AI detection on computers.
- Big Tips:
 - Have a codeword with all financial companies (banks, loans, credit cards, etc.)
 - Lock your credit with Transunion, Equifax, and Experian
 - Pay for credit monitoring?
 - Include Identify Theft on your homeowners insurance if reasonable
 - Use tools like Credit Karma to actively monitor

3. Limit Personal Information Sharing

- Privacy settings on social media: Lock down profiles and limit who can view personal details.
- Al tools can monitor the dark web for leaked personal information (e.g., Experian, Transunion, Equifax IdentityWorks).
 - But...if your credit is locked...
- Family Tip: Legitimate companies never ask for sensitive information via email or phone.

4. Verify and Double-Check

- Use AI-powered fact-checking tools (like Google's Fact Check Explorer) to verify suspicious claims.
- Ask a family member or trusted friend before making unusual payments or sharing sensitive info.
- Family Tip: Set up a "trusted contact" you can call to verify suspicious requests.

5. Monitor Financial Activity

- Al-driven banking alerts that detect unusual spending patterns.
- Credit monitoring services that flag identity theft or unauthorized accounts.
- Family Tip: Add a trusted family member (your POA? Your executor?) as a joint account observer for extra protection.

6. Block and Report Scammers

- Al-based call blockers (like Nomorobo or Hiya) that filter out robocalls.
- Report scams to authorities like the FTC or local law enforcement.
- Family Tip: Create a "Do Not Answer" list for unfamiliar numbers.
 - Block numbers on cel phones
 - Use #60 on landlines

- Al can write poems, create art, and generate music.
- Al photo enhancers bring old pictures to life.
- Al can plan trips, suggest hobbies, and even tell jokes.
