#### Monday, December 1, 2025 - PURA Monthly Meeting.

- Speaker: Jay T. Akridge, Trustee Chair in Teaching and Learning Excellence, Professor of Agricultural Economics - Purdue
- Jay Akridge teaches classes on leadership and agribusiness management and conducts research
  on agribusiness issues including technology adoption and human talent needs. Jay is co-author
  (with David Hummels) of the Substack *Finding Equilibrium* which is focused on the future of higher
  education. He served from 2017-2022 as Provost and Executive Vice President for Academic
  Affairs and Diversity at Purdue. Jay previously served for 9+ years as the Glenn W. Sample Dean of
  Agriculture. Jay is listed in Purdue's Book of Great Teachers. His family owns and operates a
  fourth-generation farm supply business in Fredonia, Kentucky.
- Topic: Rebuilding Trust in Higher Education: The Opportunity for Land-Grant Universities
- Public trust in higher education has eroded over the past two decades. Many factors have contributed to the loss of trust and created a set of extraordinary headwinds currently facing the sector. What are the factors leading to this loss of trust and what are the implications for higher

education? Despite the current challenges, land-grant universities with their unique tripartite mission (learning, discovery, engagement) have an opportunity to provide the blueprint for rebuilding trust in higher education through their relevance and impact.

# PURA University Hall Tour - Where the past meets the future

University Hall was to be the first building on the Purdue campus where classes began in the fall of 1874. It wasn't. It was the last of the six original buildings to open its doors in 1877. Today it is the only one of the original buildings still standing and the only one remaining partially funded by John Purdue who oversaw its early construction.

The October 13<sup>th</sup> PURA tour of University Hall that has been remodeled and restored to its original student focused purpose was a huge success. Forty-nine people expressed interest in going, many more than could be accommodated. The College of Liberal Arts was very generous, especially Erin VanEmon, CLA Director of Projects. The original one tour was expanded to three and the first thirty-four retirees who responded were taken through the building, ending with a presentation from John Purdue talking about his involvement with the University that shares his name and University Hall.

# **Volunteer Opportunities for PURA Members**



### **Purdue Honors PURA Member John Norberg**

John Norberg, Purdue University historian and acclaimed author and journalist, has been named the 2025 recipient of Purdue's Distinguished Boilermaker Award. The honor recognizes individuals who embody the spirit of the Boilermaker — industriousness and innovation, dedication and diligence, gratitude and grit, and service above self.

Norberg has helped preserve and share the university's story for generations of students, alumni, and friends through his nine books chronicling Purdue's remarkable people, history, and traditions, and through his engaging portrayal of benefactor John Purdue at campus and community events. His work reflects a deep and abiding love for Purdue and a life that exemplifies being "ever grateful, ever true."

Norberg joined Purdue in 2000 as speechwriter to then-President Martin C. Jischke and later served as director of communications for development. Before coming to Purdue, he built a distinguished career with the Lafayette Journal & Courier, where he wrote a popular column for more than 40 years and earned more than 50 state and national journalism awards. His writing has appeared in USA Today, Time, the Christian Science Monitor and the Saturday Evening Post, and he has been featured on CBS News Sunday Morning and NPR's Big Picture Science. Among his many honors, Norberg is a member of the Indiana Journalism Hall of Fame, and he also has received the Purdue for Life Foundation's Special Boilermaker Award and the Block P Award from Purdue Bands & Orchestras.



# Reminder - Parking for Events at the Elliott Hall of Music

Effective October 2, 2025, paid event parking at campus parking garages and lots that support evening and weekend events at the Elliott Hall of Music will be required. A paid event parking pass through ParkMobile will need to be purchased for the following parking locations starting two hours before each weeknight or weekend event:

- Northwestern Avenue Parking Garage
- University Street Parking Garage

- The parking lot directly north of Lawson Computer Science Building
- · Accessible parking spaces in the Armory lot

Eligible Purdue parking permit holders, including retirees with an "A" parking permit, who are parked in one of the locations above prior to the two hours that the event parking rates take effect will be able to remain parked with no event parking pass required.

When arriving for an Elliott Hall of Music event after the time the event parking begins at the four event designated locations, individuals will either need to pay for the event parking rate or seek alternative, free parking in one of the following lots:

- On Russell Street between Fifth and Sixth Streets
- On Waldron Street between Fifth and Sixth Streets
- South of Duhme Residence Hall

Event parking passes cost \$11.50 and may be purchased in advance through ParkMobile: https://app.parkmobile.io.
